

# Extended Continental Shelf Submissions to the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf by the Republic of Mauritius

## Abstract

The Republic of Mauritius is Party to the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (the Convention), which it signed on the day it was opened for signature on 10 December 1982, and subsequently ratified on 4 November 1984. The Maritime Zones Act 2005 provides that the provisions of the Convention have the force of law in the Republic of Mauritius, and establishes maritime zones in accordance with the provisions of the Convention, including provisions defining the outer limits of the continental shelf.

The Republic of Mauritius has, for the purposes of preparing submissions to the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf (CLCS), applied the relevant provisions of Article 76 of the Convention together with the relevant provisions of the Rules of Procedure of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf and, the recommendations contained in the Scientific and Technical Guidelines of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf.

The Republic of Mauritius has already made two parallel Submissions and a Preliminary Information.

## Submission in Mascarene Plateau Region

In December 2008, the Republic of Mauritius and the Republic of Seychelles made a Joint Submission to the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf for an Extended Continental Shelf (ECS) area in the region of the Mascarene Plateau.

ECS Area: Approximately 396,000 sq. km

In March 2011, the CLCS made its recommendations which resulted in Mauritius and Seychelles being jointly conferred the jurisdiction upon the joint area.

In March 2012, Mauritius and Seychelles signed two treaties allowing the establishment of the Joint Management Area (JMA) in which the two States exercise sovereign rights jointly for the purpose of exploring the continental shelf and exploiting its natural resources.

## Submission in the Region of Rodrigues Island

In May 2009, the Republic of Mauritius submitted to the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf information on the limits of the continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles from the baselines from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured in the region of Rodrigues Island.

ECS Area: Approximately 182,000 sq. km

## Preliminary Information in Chagos Archipelago Region

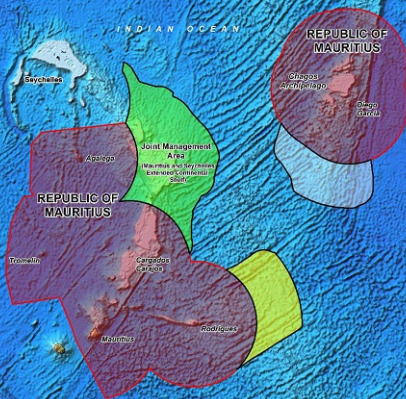
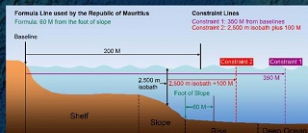
In May 2009, the Republic of Mauritius submitted Preliminary Information in respect to an area of its Extended Continental Shelf in the region of Chagos Archipelago.
